# Transportation and Deliveries

**Goods movement and deliveries** Local businesses will be still able to make and receive deliveries in Yaletown and downtown Vancouver, but we strongly encourage flexibility in timing your deliveries. Mainland and Hamilton Streets may be closed to all vehicles 11 am - midnight every day during the Games. In order to avoid congestion and/or road closures, plan all deliveries between 12 midnight and 11 am. VANOC and the City of Vancouver are meeting with local businesses directly affected by changes to the road network during the Games, and will make any adjustments. The City is also looking at options for changing garbage collection schedules downtown. Stay tuned for more information.

### You can make commuting easier

- Modify business hours/days or offer a compressed work week to your employees.
- Encourage employees to take transit outside of peak travel times.
- Promote travel by ride-sharing, walking or cycling.
- Allow your employees to tele-work (visit [www.translink.ca/en/TravelSmart/Teleworking.aspx](http://www.translink.ca/en/TravelSmart/Teleworking.aspx)).
- Modify business operations - offer employees vacations, or unpaid leave to enjoy the Games.
- In the business of moving goods? Consider time-shifting deliveries and/or utilizing different routes.
- Install secured bicycle racks to make it that much easier for staff to cycle to work during the Games.
- Extend your hours of operation. Expect Yaletown to be busy noon to midnight.

### You can plan commercial deliveries

- Change delivery times with suppliers to take place from midnight to noon, and before 6 am if possible.
- Scope out back lane delivery set up.
- Order as many supplies in advance to minimize deliveries during the Games.
- Consider scheduling your deliveries from common suppliers with a similar or neighbouring business in the vicinity.

### Olympic Lanes and Security-Based Road Closures

Olympic Lanes in the City of Vancouver will be dedicated to Olympic vehicles and public transit buses 24 hours a day and will operate in one lane of traffic. Specific roads will be closed to the public to ensure the safety of athletes, officials, spectators, workforce and the general public. See the map on reverse of this page to see the planned Olympic lanes and security-based road closures.

### Parking

For venue and security reasons, there will be no parking at 2010 Olympic and Paralympic venues during the Games (February 12 - 28, 2010). VANOC vehicles and motor coaches will operate 24 hours a day, and public transit will operate for longer hours than normal. For that reason, there will be 24-hour on-street parking restrictions on many streets in Vancouver.

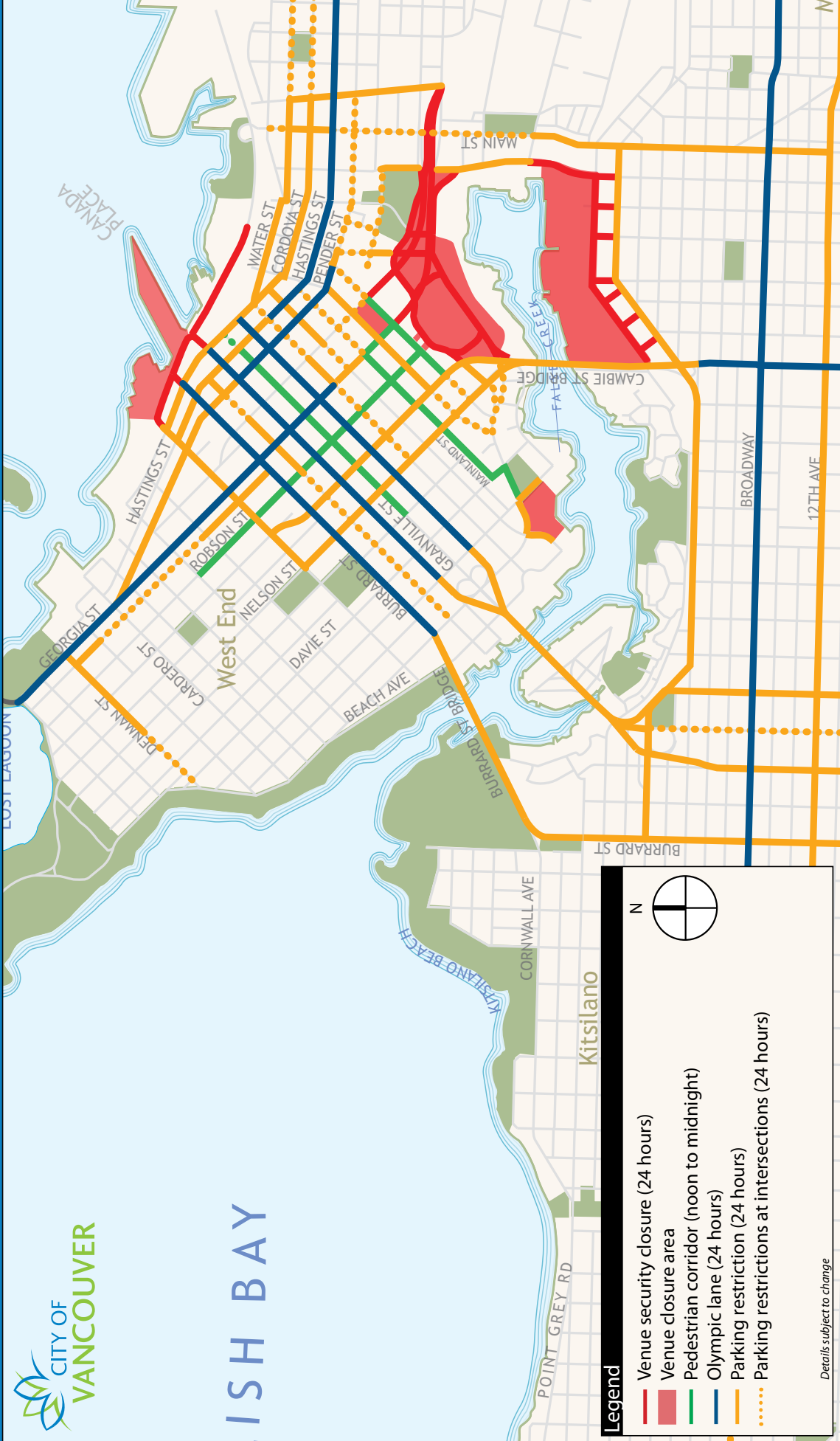
